### Participation:

Class participation is an important component of the Biology curriculum. Much can be learned from the exchange of ideas that occurs during class discussions. Frequent absences SERIOUSLY jeopardize your success in this class.

#### Test and Quizzes

Tests and quizzes will be announced ahead of time. They are posted on the board in the classroom, on CTLS, as well as the blog. It is your responsibility to be aware of these dates. Should you be absent the day before a test, you are still expected to take it.

#### **Grade Pooks**

- All grade books will be standards-based.
- Grade book categories will be representative of units or topics of study.

#### **Reassessment**

- All students will be allowed to reassess on any of the standards for the course provided the following conditions are met.
  - o The student must have taken the original assessment.
  - Students must have <u>NO ZEROS</u> for the unit being reassessed.
  - Complete remediation tasks this will be done via <u>www.usatestprep.com</u> So you MUST have an account. It is also the STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY TO CONTACT MRS. KUCERA WHEN THEY FAIL A TEST AND WISH TO RETEST.
  - Once remediation work has been completed, students need to contact me that they are finished and I will then assign the retest to be taken on usatestprep.
  - O YOU HAVE 10 SCHOOL DAYS TO COMPLETE THE REASSESSMENT FROM THE DAY THAT THE ORIGINAL ASSESSMENT WAS GIVEN BACK TO YOU.



### Students absent on or prior to the day of an assessment

- If a student is present on the day of an assessment, then he is required to participate in the assessment regardless of having been absent for any of the instructional days leading up to the assessment.
- If a student is absent on the day of an assessment, then the teacher may require the student to participate in the assessment immediately upon returning to class regardless of any instructional days the student may have missed. Doing this is a benefit to the student as it will prevent him from receiving a zero if he fails to make up the assessment within the allotted time. This also makes the student eligible to reassess on those standards when s/he is ready.

## Absence from Class:

If you are absent from a class session, check the BLOG for the day you missed. If you missed a test or a quiz, you have to make it up within a week. It is your responsibility to arrange a makeup time. Everything not made up will be recorded as zeros.

## Late Work Policy:

**NO WORK WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER THE UNIT TEST HAS BEEN TAKEN.** Any work submitted after the due date will have 20% deducted (up until the unit test date).

#### Cell Phones and Electronic Devices:

As per the school's policy, cell phones are **NOT** to be used during class time unless directed by the teacher for instructional purposes. Students will receive a discipline referral after one warning to put away any electronic device (unless the device is being used for instruction).

## Academic Integrity:

Cheating is considered a serious matter. Any student who is involved in cheating/plagiarism will receive a grade of <u>zero</u> on the material, an unsatisfactory in conduct, and his/her parents will be notified.

## For Mrs. Kucera's Classroom, cheating is defined as, but is not limited to, the following acts:

- Copying anyone's answers to questions, exercises, study guides, classwork or homework assignments
- Taking any information verbatim from any source, including the Internet, without giving proper credit to the author, or rearranging the order of words and/or changing some words as written by the author and claiming the work as his or her own, i.e., plagiarism.
- Looking onto another student's paper during a test or quiz.
- Having available any study notes or other test aids during a test or quiz without the teacher's permission.
- Collaborating on assignments when independent work is expected.
- ANY type of communication while tests or quizzes are distributed. The classroom will be silent until the last person has completed their test. Even if a student has completed their test, they will still receive a zero if they communicate in any way with another student in the classroom.

## Discipline:

Students failing to abide by any of the general class rules (with the exception of the cell phone policy which is separate) above are subject to the discipline policy below as well as disciplinary action in accordance with the McEachern High School student handbook.

#### Extra Help:


